Readers' Ideas for Loving Our Children Well

- Shepherd their hearts. Hearts are way more important than behaviors!
- Have clear rules and expectations. Set them early on, and be consistent (not legalistic) about enforcing them.
- Teach your child about good decision-making, starting with small ones. Teach them to own choices and consequences.
- Reduce rules as your child grows in maturity and responsibility.
- Beware of labeling your child shy, not athletic, not booksmart, etc. Speak life over them at all times.
- Say yes whenever possible. Pick your battles carefully. Let your yes be yes and your no be no.
- Teach your child what God says about sin. Train them to recognize it and ask God's forgiveness quickly.
- Allow their faith to become their own even when they drift a little; even when it's hard to watch.
- Don't avoid teaching them about "the birds and the bees." If you don't, the world will teach the worldly version.
- Teach them to repent and seek forgiveness when they hurt someone vs. a meaningless "sorry."
- Trust God with your child at all times, in all areas. Pray about every area of their lives!

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
